Completing this specialised course in diecasting ensures that there are no gaps in technical knowledge for employees and it can help to avoid bad habits being learned, greatly improving their performance and reducing the incidence of out of spec castings being produced.

The Cast Metals Federation is supporting this online course in the UK with local experts who can provide workshops, mentoring and additional training as required.
